


A RESOLUTION FOR THE GEORGIA GOP TO SUPPORT CLOSING GEORGIA PRIMARIES

WHEREAS, Georgia currently has open primaries that allow voters from one political party to “cross-over” and vote in the opposition’s party primary election; and

WHEREAS, in the past two primary elections held in Georgia, many Republicans believe that Democrats have “crossed over” to vote in Republican primaries in order to select the weakest Republican candidate in order to influence the Republican’s primary results; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Lanier Republican Assembly, meeting at its Annual Convention, February 21, 2026, supports closing Georgia’s Primary elections such that a voter must declare their party and vote only in their party’s Primary; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, this Convention demands that the GAGOP also support closing Georgia’s primary elections.

A RESOLUTION ENSURING ELECTION INTEGRITY FOR ALL GEORGIA ELECTIONS AND ITS PROCESSES

WHEREAS, election integrity is essential to public trust and democracy; and

WHEREAS, under O.C.G.A. § 21-2-437, § 21-2-454 provides for secure elections, including hand-marked and hand-counted paper ballots; and

WHEREAS, expert testimony has revealed that Georgia’s voting system was designed and installed with remote access capabilities and was accessed remotely during the 2020 General Election and 2021 Runoff Election; and

WHEREAS, Dominion Voting Systems presents security concerns due to foreign corporate control, software access, and foreign-manufactured components; and WHEREAS, forensic analysis found that Georgia’s Election Management System (EMS) contains vulnerabilities, including unencrypted encryption keys stored in plain text; and


WHEREAS, low-resolution Dominion ballot images are inadequate to detect fraudulent ballots and vulnerable to tampering; and

WHEREAS, electronic voting systems do not provide adequate security provisions to ensure election integrity;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Lanier Republican Assembly, meeting at its Annual Convention, February 21, 2026, demands the Georgia General Assembly pass an amendment directing all election officials to immediately transition to hand-marked paper ballots, certified at the precinct level; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the above amendment shall include all enforceable penalties, including monetary fines and criminal liability for any individual found guilty of engaging in misconduct, which distracts from accountability and the safeguarding of the integrity of Georgia’s election process; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Georgia General Assembly shall terminate all contracts with Dominion Voting Machines.

A RESOLUTION TO ENACT A FAIR TAX CODE IN GEORGIA

Whereas Georgians request Georgia Legislators generate a FairTax Code with these characteristics:

- Eliminates state income taxes on households and businesses
- Eliminates filing State income tax forms
- Includes a monthly prebate check, according to family size, for payment of taxes for basic goods and services up to the poverty level
- Taxes new retail goods and services only at point of sale

WHEREAS the FairTax delivers a consumption tax which generates sufficient funding required for the operation of State Government; and

WHEREAS the Fair Tax broadens tax bases to capture underground economies; generates new businesses; creates investment to grow Georgia's economy; Georgians would keep all of their paychecks, except federal deductions; and

WHEREAS tax collection is established, simple, fair, and transparent; and

WHEREAS other states have or are considering similar tax structures, therefore

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, delegates of this Convention request Georgia Legislators generate a FairTax collection system and repeal the current tax code.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Secretary of Georgia Republican Party Convention is directed to immediately transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the Chairman of the Georgia Republican Party and to all elected Republican officials in the Georgia Senate and in the Georgia House; to the Honorable Brian P. Kemp, Governor of the State of Georgia, the Honorable Burt Jones, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Georgia; and to the Honorable Jon Burns, Speaker of the House of Representatives.

A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF OVER-THE-COUNTER ACCESS TO IVERMECTIN


WHEREAS, Georgia's Lanier Republican Assembly supports individual liberty, personal responsibility, and limited government in healthcare, as enshrined in the U.S. and Georgia Constitutions; and

WHEREAS, Georgians have the right to access safe, affordable treatments like Ivermectin, discovered in 1975, FDA-approved for human use in 1987, with 3.7 billion doses since, earning a 2015 Nobel Prize, listed on WHO's Essential Medicines, showing antiviral action against HIV-1 and COVID, and no human resistance in over 25 years; and

WHEREAS, states like Tennessee, Minnesota, Missouri, West Virginia, Texas, Kentucky, South Carolina, Arkansas, Georgia, Pennsylvania, Oklahoma, and Alabama have proposed or passed OTC Ivermectin laws, with Tennessee's Senate Bill 2188 (2022) showing no incidents after two years; and

WHEREAS, Georgians have limited access to Ivermectin which restricts health freedom;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Lanier Republican Assembly, meeting at its Annual Convention, February 21, 2026, supports Georgia legislation for over-the-counter Ivermectin access with pharmacist oversight; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution be sent to Georgia's House, Senate, Governor Brian Kemp, the Georgia Department of Public Health, and Banks, White, Habersham, Gwinnett, Hall, Jackson, and Lumpkin County legislators.

WHEREAS, all Georgia's libraries, including schools, are affiliated with the American Library Association (ALA), a self-proclaimed socialist/Marxist organization; and

WHEREAS, during the 2025 legislative session, the members of the Georgia Senate submitted S.B. 74, which intends to rectify the O.C.G.A. 16-12-104 exemption; and


WHEREAS, during the 2026 legislative session, SB74 passed the House Judiciary Non-Civil Committee and has been presented to the House Rules Committee, and is now waiting to be called to the House Floor by the Speaker to be voted upon by the House of Representatives

WHEREAS, S.B. 390 passed in the Senate but was not sent to the House during the 2023 Legislative session; and

WHEREAS, S.B. 390 needs to be revived, passed, and sent to the House for passage during the 2027 legislative session and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Lanier Republican Assembly, meeting at its Annual Convention, 21 Day, 2026, demands the Georgia General Assembly demand that the Georgia Legislature pass SB74 this 2026 legislative session and that they revive SB 390 in the next (2027) legislative session. Expressly to stop the influx of age-inappropriate, obscene, and pornographic material in our libraries, allowed by OCGA 16-12-104, this 2026 legislative session, and to sever ties with the ALA at the next (2027) legislative session.
